Extra Help Low Income Subsidy for Medicare Prescription Drug Coverage

The Low Income Subsidy (LIS) is paid by the federal government to the drug plan (Part D) in which the Medicare beneficiary enrolls. The subsidy provides assistance with the premium, deductible, and co-payments of the program.

Once you qualify

- Medicare will pay 75% or more of your prescription drug costs
- With no coverage gaps, you will automatically receive help paying
 - ✓ Premiums
 - Deductibles
 - Co-pays of your Part D Prescription Drug Coverage



Medicare Savings Programs

If you have limited income and resources, you may be able to get help to pay your Medicare costs if you meet certain conditions.



Medicare Savings Programs

- Qualified Medicare Beneficiary Program (QMB)
 Helps pay for Part A and/or Part B premiums. In addition,
 Medicare providers aren't allowed to bill you for Medicare
 deductibles, coinsurance, and copayments when you
 get services and items Medicare covers, except
 outpatient prescription drugs.
- ▲ Low Income Medicare Beneficiary (LMB) Helps pay Part B premiums only.
- Expanded Low Income Medicare Beneficiary (ELMB)
 Helps pay Part B premiums only. You must apply each
 year for ELMB benefits. Applications are granted on a
 first-come first-served basis.
